OTHER UPDATES/INFORMATION

- Received the Executive Chief Fire Officer certification from the 2022 State of Colorado Fire Chiefs conference. Learned a great deal and look forward to bringing that education and training back to NFPD.
- The New Explorer Pre-School and the Nederland Elementary school paid Fire Station 1 a visit. This was amazing to have all of the kids come and learn about fire prevention and a meeting place in a event of a incident.
- Had the opportunity to proctor Fire officer II and Fire Instructor II.
- We are currently testing a new calendar software for shift / training schedules. We are also looking a software to do NFIRs so the District can look and using a free EPCR software, we currently pay for. This could save the district several thousand dollars if the software applications mesh well with Nederland operations.
- The CDOT application for a permit to hang NFD district sign within our district is being worked on my Auxiliary Member Jess.
- Work is nearing completion of the Town of Eldora All-Hazards disaster plan in the event of an incident. There is a challenge in receiving the data that is needed to complete.
- Proctored Fire Instructor 2 in Ignacio CO.
- Working on the edits for the Standards of Cover document so the community and membership can have a reference for operations within our District.



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Operations/ Wildland

Calls of significance:

- Overdose that turned into an arrest, ended in a DOA
- Challenges surrounding not having a PD presence with CBI, and a Coroner needed on calls involving death.
- Chainsaw injury mutual aid call with Timberline Fire, as a Tourniquet was applied to injury and transported by Gilpin ambulance.
- Broke ground on burn building but am waiting on town to finalize excavation.

Projects:

- Troubleshoot broken exterior lighting and have several new sensors on order.
- 5624 graphics were finally installed by husky graphics.
- Meeting with Eldora and discussed emergency response with them. They advised that they have built 50% more parking spots and they have invested 10 million dollars this year on improvements and that they will be investing an additional 50 million over the next 10 years.
- We are working on pump testing and hose testing having trouble returning calls

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Large Scale Training Projects

- The invitation to the November 20th all county EMS Skills Day. The coordination of instructors and potential instructors has been rewarding. We currently have RSVPs from 6 different agencies across the county.
- New batteries and preventative maintenance have been completed for all Lifepak 15s, AEDs and LUCAS device. The service contract is critical to our EMS equipment.

RESOLUTION 2022-085

A resolution approving the Nederland Fire Protection District's adoption of the 2018 Edition of the International Fire Code, with local amendments, for application within the Nederland Fire Protection District territory in unincorporated Boulder County

Recitals

A. C.R.S. § 32-1-1002(1)(d) authorizes the board of any fire protection district to adopt and enforce a fire code, as the fire district board deems necessary, provided that “no such code shall apply within . . . the unincorporated portion of any county unless the governing body of the . . . county . . . adopts a resolution stating that such code or specific portions thereof shall be applicable within the fire protection district’s boundaries.”

B. By Resolution adopted on July 27, 2022, the Board of Directors of the Nederland Fire Protection District (the “Fire District”) adopted the 2018 Edition of the International Fire Code, with local amendments (the “2018 International Fire Code Adoption”).

C. The Fire District now wishes to have the Board of County Commissioners of the County of Boulder (the “County Board”) approve the adopted and amended code for application within the Fire District territory in unincorporated Boulder County.

D. The above-described request for County Board approval of the 2018 International Fire Code Adoption under C.R.S. § 32-1-1002(1)(d) is further described in the Community Planning & Permitting Department’s Chief Building Official’s memorandum and written recommendation to the County Board, with its attached materials, dated October 20, 2022 (the “Building Official’s Recommendation”).

E. Pursuant to Resolution 82-41 of the County Board establishing a fire code review process for the unincorporated areas of the County, the County’s Fire Code Review Committee held a duly noticed public hearing on the 2018 International Fire Code Adoption on May 24, 2022, and, based on that hearing, recommended approval of the Adoption to the County Board.

F. On October 20, 2022, the County Board held a duly-noticed public hearing on the above-described request for County Board approval of the 2018 International Fire Code Adoption under C.R.S. § 32-1-1002(1)(d) (the “Public Hearing”), at which time the County Board considered the Building Official’s Recommendation and the documents and testimony presented by the County’s Chief Building Official and a representative of the Fire District, with no members of the public speaking to the Fire District’s request, all as further reflected in the official record of the Public Hearing.

G. Based on the Public Hearing, and as set forth in the Building Official's Recommendation, the County Board finds that the 2018 International Fire Code Adoption is reasonable and appropriate for application within the Fire District territory in unincorporated Boulder County, and approves the 2018 International Fire Code Adoption for this purpose pursuant to C.R.S. § 32-1-1002(1)(d).

Therefore, the Board resolves:

The County Board approves the 2018 International Fire Code Adoption, as described herein and incorporated herein by this reference, for application within the Fire District territory in unincorporated Boulder County pursuant to C.R.S. § 32-1-1002(1)(d).

A motion to approve the 2018 International Fire Code Adoption, as stated above, was made by Commissioner Claire Levy, seconded by Commissioner Matt Jones, and passed by a 3-0 vote.

ADOPTED as a final decision of the County Board on this 1st day of November 2022, *nunc pro tunc* the 20th day of October 2022.
