### **ACTION ITEMS**

Discussion of Fire Marshal Step Pay scale. Per Fire Marshal Joslin, He was told By Former Chief Scott that as he received more certifications his pay would reflect that. Currently he has finished his Fire inspector 1 (step increase) and Fire Instructor (received step increase). Per the adopted code that went affect in 1/22 and 10/22 the fire code official is required to have their FIT (Fire Investigator). The Fire Marshal has several preferred certifications on his job description and has no described step increase. See attached job offer.

### **OTHER UPDATES/INFORMATION**

#### **Calls of significance:**

Possible Structure fire- Kitchen fire isolated to the dishwasher.

Lost snowboarder at caribou was out for appx 29 hours. He was found on the road by rescuers, he was transported by NFPD.

Eldora numbers have increased this year. 1 Saturday this month, they had a significant trauma with a chopper go, and they 4 ambulances either enroute or on scene at Eldora. They had 38 patients that day alone at the ski area.

#### **Operations/ Wildland**

5621 (main ambulance) steering box that was replaced about 2000 miles ago is leaking. We have spoken with the shop that has performed the repairs and believe it will be prepared under warranty.

5601 (Main Engine) Telma has malfunctioned. We have replaced the controller in hopes to fix it, we had to make some updates to get the new controller to work (old one is outdated) It has not fixed the problem, this will need to go out and be repaired. Need to replace the tires on 5617.

5617 has returned from Front Range Fire. One of the repairs that we had performed was on the generator. It still doesn't work. They are supposed to be sending up a technician to make the repair.



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UTV has arrived, we are still collecting the parts for the completion of the project. 5652 Has a battery drain, is currently at East Street Garage getting diagnosed. 5632 is currently having the fuel tank removed at Charlie's house in preparation for the new fuel pick up.

We had 7 batteries for our extrication tools replaced under a recall from MES and waiting on the 8<sup>th</sup>. This is a big deal, we thought we'd have to buy new ones. We possibly have a bad charger though.

Currently Preparing for the badging and promotion ceremony on March 23<sup>rd</sup>.

We received the last of the bunker gear to complete our firefighter disease and safety grant, the invoice has been paid and the reimbursement packet has been submitted.

Cleaned out Chiefs office and packaged all his personal items.

I met with MES and did a site visit for a new SCBA compressor. The prices seem comparable, the difference with the new bid is that they will require the room next to 5644 to use due to air flow and the size of the unit, this may add an additional cost for electrical. See attached bids.

I found a receipt for Former Chief Scotts registration for FDIC, and Sherry is working on getting a refund, as well as contacting an agency for the notice for a stipend for a south Dakota conference.

### Safety/ Training

Total documented monthly training hours completed in January: 104 hrs

#### District fire trainings completed:

- On Feb 11<sup>th</sup> NFPD hosted an interagency forcible entry training with TLFD with 28 people in attendance. The training was a great success for both agencies.
- On Feb 25<sup>th</sup> NFPD hosted an interagency backcountry rescue training with RMRG. The training reviewed winter operations where RMRMG and NFPD co respond and lead to some great discussion around the use of a SKED.

- FFs M. Papich, S Papich and E. Abramson all passed their Driver operator written test. E. Abramson is now fully certified as a driver operator

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- Interim Chief Schmidtman passed his Fire Officer II written certification and is now fully certified at the FO-II level

### EMS

EMR class is in process with 20 students.

Working to transition NREMT, CDPHE, DEA and EMT application, points of contact/gatekeeper/program director roles over to current members of the dept.

Ambulance inspections (medical and mechanical) completed and awaiting county approval.

EMT Application returned by state to revise.

Continued training of all engaged members in EMS regardless of certification.

### Fire Marshal

#### Training & Ongoing Activities:

Went to the International Code Council (ICC) conference in Loveland. Attended classes on residential sprinkler design and inspection, commercial fire suppression systems, and means of egress review. This was very beneficial and allowed for a deeper level of Code interpretation and understanding, as well as networking and opportunities to share experiences and learn from them.

EMT and CPR was successfully renewed with NREMT.

Served Jury Duty Monday March 13<sup>th</sup>.

Investigator – completed additional study session, preparing for testing.

#### Routine Inspections & Plan Reviews:

Performing several business inspections, food truck renewals, and several new business inspections, no major compliance issues in the district. Also both schools have completed their scheduled Fire Safety Inspections and necessary repairs are underway by BVSD.

Working on several Site Plan Review's for the County and a handful within the Town of Nederland. There are a couple that have gone for Chief review, there's potentially one that may come to the Chief and board this summer. Typically, SPR's only go to the Chief if the applicant disagrees with the



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interpretation of the adopted Code or if they ask for a variance or change in operations. It is currently on hold at the County level for weather reasons.

### **Projects:**

Wildland Pre-Plans – met with P. Richardson for guidance on his experience developing maps and the processes they took. Working on developing templates that can be delegated to a team to start sectioning our district into actionable map areas based on strategy and risk assessment.

First Due – working on the implementation phase to transfer business, property, and assets data to the First Due team.

Fire Investigations – completed a fire investigation and executive summary report for a fire in our District.

It is with great pleasure that Netherland Fire Protection District (NFPD) extends a conditional offer of employment for the position of Fire Marshal at a starting hourly rate of \$36.06 / hour non-exempt, equivalent to \$56,250 per year. This position is 30 hours a week. This will include vacation, sick time, health, dental, and vision insurance, and participation in the Fire and Police Pension Association (FPPA), and any other associated benefit offered by the district.

**The FPPA Defined Benefit Plan:** The district will contribute 9% of base wages in and 12% will be deducted from your paycheck. The district contribution will increase by .5% annually until a maximum of 12% is reached. The district's contributions become vested following 5 years of service (your previous service may accrue towards vesting; you are encouraged to inquire with FPPA to confirm). No social security (FICA) will be deducted from your paycheck. Your years of employment under FPPA will not count towards social security income. Your participation in the FPPA pension plan may negatively impact social security payout, based on the Windfall Protection Act, you are encouraged to understand this impact and will be required to sign the SSA-1945 social security form.

**FPPA 457 Deferred Compensation Plan:** You will be eligible to participate in the district's 457 plan. Currently you may contribute up to \$20,500 pretax dollars. No District contribution will be made.

**Accidental Death and Disability Plan:** The District will pay 3% of your base pay towards the FPPA AD&D plan.

**Normal Work Hours:** Your regular work hours will be 30 hours within the times 0800-1700, Monday to Friday. The nature of your role may require you to work outside these hours or in addition to your base hours. You may alter your work hours if required to meet personal or district needs, however, your work week hours should not be less than 30 hours. Should your work require more than 30 hours in any one work week you must obtain authorization from the Fire Chief prior to working additional hours.

Should you work in excess of 30 hours you will be paid normal time up to 40 hours and overtime at time-and-a-half beyond 40 hours.

**Benefits:** The department offers the following benefits for all staff.

- Employee health care premiums covered 100% and dependent premiums at 50%.
- Dental cover premiums are covered 100% for employee. The department does not cover dependents, but they may be added to our coverage at your own cost.

This conditional offer of employment is contingent upon successful completion of a formal background check, motor vehicle records review and ability to obtain a valid Colorado driver's license upon hire.

Your employment is subject to a probationary period with set goals, and certification completion requirements per the posting. The goals for 2022 will be evaluated and your performance at the end of the year. I will provide regular performance appraisals to ensure the goals of the department are being met.

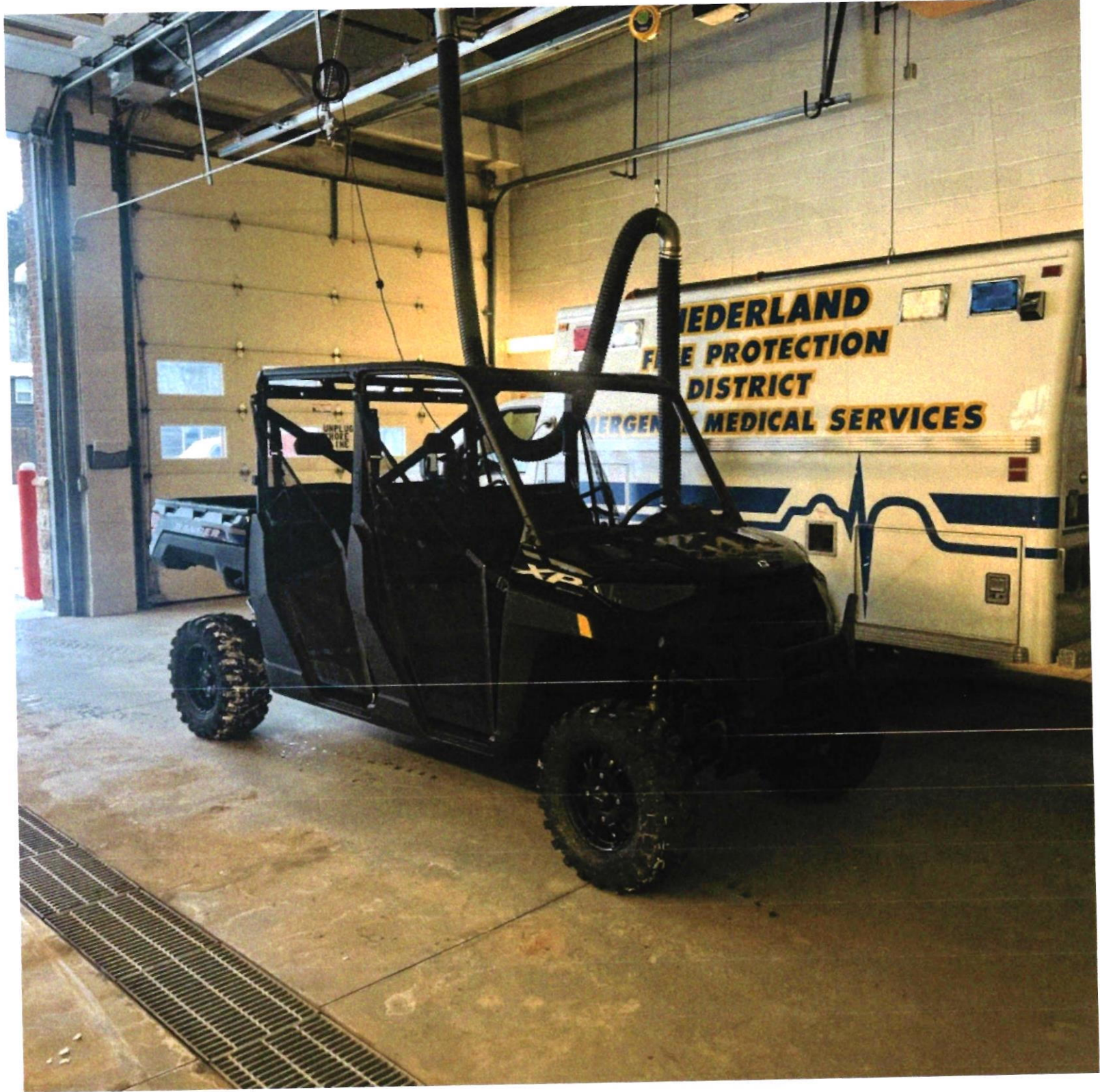
