- > Negative balance in checking reflects monthly payroll draw and funds not yet transferred from savings account to checking
- ➤ July 2022 approximately 40k ahead of July 2021
- ➤ Total income to date is approximately 91% of expected for 2022
- > Expenses
  - July: \$4.4k overspend vs budget
  - YTD \$28.7k overspend

- Presentation: Dylana Gross
  - ➤ Works for Public Trust Advisors, hired by ColoTrust Board to manage funds
  - ➤ Works with Stephanie Cooke
  - ColoTrust (https://www.colotrust.com/about/)
    - Local government investment pool established in 1985
    - Works with approximately 1700 entities (i.e., special districts, school districts, towns)
    - Manages approximately \$14.7 billion in assets
  - Advantages of investing money with ColoTrust
    - Size allows for diversification, lower fees, better rates of return
    - Daily liquidity
    - No fees; no account minimum or maximum
  - ➤ Public Trust advisor fee: 0.12%; returns start at 1.8% after this fee for most conservative portfolio
  - ➤ Not a replacement for checking account; more of a holding account
- Discussion of ColoTrust information
- Motion to allow Stephanie Cooke to work with Dylana Gross on behalf of the NFPD to gather more information regarding ColoTrust

- Motion to allow Stephanie Cooke to explore alternative banking options for the NFPD

- Chief's Report
  - Thank you to Jim Harrison for 20 years of service
  - $\triangleright$  Hiring: Part-time administrator MWF 8 5 (24 hr)
    - Does not need to be fire certified
  - ➤ Boulder Water (BW) has requested NFPD take over maintenance of 2 hydrants on Cold Springs
    - BW will pay \$2k/year; maintenance = responsible for back flow valve; would have to hire hydrant maintenance company
    - SLFPD has a similar contract
    - Ron (from insurance company) said it will increase our liability and suggests we speak with our legal counsel
    - Discussion: Why now? Why doesn't BW just hire the maintenance company
  - Community Events: National Night Out (NNO) (August 2<sup>nd</sup>) was successful
    - Jess McElvain spoke for the NFDA at Chief Scott's request
    - Big thanks to the Ned DDA approved an event grant which covered costs
    - Leah from Face Fiesta (face painter) very popular
    - Next year with more time to plan hope to expand (food trucks, Kona ice)
  - > CDOT district boundary application is underway
  - Disaster plan
    - Miranda stretched thin, Chief Scott wrote disaster plan for town
    - Comment from Iain: Town of Eldora needs evacuation plan would like to Chief Scott to write
    - Disaster plan needs to be completed for entire district
  - ➤ Eldora Civic Association (EAC) would like to use Station 3 for events, including the annual meeting August 20<sup>th</sup>

- ➤ Hiring: Mechanic Position
  - Would like to proceed with hiring a mechanic to cover 4 districts (NFPD, SLFPD, Timberline, Coal Creek)
    - Each district does not need a full-time mechanic, it is difficult to find someone who is willing to work part-time
  - Meeting with other district chiefs in the next week to discuss
  - If quick consensus cannot be reached, need to hire our own because of added workload (refer to Chief's report on everything C. Schmidtmann has fixed)
- > 5631 pump and tank have been ordered
  - After ordering Castle Rock Fire and Rescue donated pump and tank to NFPD
    - Able to use donated pump and tank of 5633
    - Thank you to Castle Rock for the generous donation
- Volunteer Recruits
  - Completed interview process
  - 5 candidates for to start training academy (September 18<sup>th</sup>)
    - Ideal would be 6 8 recruits in training academy
  - Have encouraged a few more people to apply
- Community Thanks
  - Dawn Baumhover: called to compliment class that Conor and Cameron Moran taught at the community center about disaster preparedness. Relayed that after the course the staff feels very prepared

# • Fire Marshall's Report (presented by Chief Scott)

- ➤ Work continues to improve automation and tracking of fire inspections
- ➤ County has received updated IFC 2018 and is reviewing ahead of approval
- Andrew may have found Fire Inspector I course in Denver to attend for certification Boulder Water (BW) has requested NFPD take over maintenance of 2 hydrants on Cold

#### • 2021 Audit

- Audit needs to be delivered to the State of CO by September 30, 2022
- ➤ Iain has reached out to the auditor multiple times
- May ask attorney to pursue

# • Pension Board (for Volunteers)

- > Legally required
- Consists of regular NFPD board and 2 more volunteers from fire community (retired or left service)
- > Supposed to meet twice a year
  - Have met approximately twice in the last 10 years
  - Need to revive
- ➤ Volunteer pension fund is fully funded (approximately 102%)
- Responsibilities include approving pension requests

# • Mill Levy Survey

- Note: This survey was sent out prior to Boulder County (BoCo) and the Town of Nederland notifying residents that they are also pursuing tax increases
- ➤ 63 responses: in general positive
  - $\bullet$  80 90% support for ballot question of a phased in 3 mil levy increase
  - Concerns about tax increases are especially hard on those living on a fixed income

#### **New Business**

# • Town of Nederland Police Department

- Town has presented 3 options to raise revenue to improve PD funding
  - Increase marijuana sales tax, increase town sales tax, increase property taxes (this
    would affect a subset of properties within the NFPD boundaries)
- Discussion about how this might affect NFPD's proposed mill levy request

### • Boulder County Tax Increase

- ➤ Iain Irwin-Powell and Russ Panneton attended public meeting where BoCo discussed impacts
- ➤ Discussion of BoCo's proposed ballot question
  - Language is vague as to who receives money, multiple special interests listed
  - Mountain fire chiefs were not consulted
  - BoCo does not appear to have a clear distribution plan; not guaranteed that mountain districts will receive any significant funding, consistently from proposed measures
  - It appears to compete with NFPD's proposed mill levy increase, but BoCo's ballot proposal does not because there are no guaranteed funds for mountain fire districts

# • NFPD Mill Levy Proposal: IGA with Boulder County and Ballot Language

- ➤ IGA reviewed by lawyer and is no concerns
  - Does not list NFPD's part of election cost, hope it would be less than what it would cost for district to do own mail in ballot election (est \$14k \$20k)
- ➤ Ballot language for mill levy was written by district lawyer
- ➤ Discussion: Do we wait for BoCo to supply more information/clarification on their proposed ballot questions before deciding on NFPDs ballot question?
  - NFPD requires guaranteed funding to execute vehicle replacement plan
  - BoCo has proved itself to be an unreliable partner when it comes to consistent funding (see PILT funds = funds provided to states by federal government in replace lost tax revenue on federal lands)
  - BoCo has no official breakdown of fund distribution and many agencies listed as potential fund recipients
  - Any agreement reached with BoCo needs to be formalized with an IGA
  - NFPD cannot wait to see if BoCo gives us sufficient funds reliably. NFPD has a dire need to replace equipment.

# • Motion to approve NFPD Resolution 2022-08

- Approves ballot language for mill levy increase on November 2022 ballot and IGA with county
